Easy Ways To Improve Your Resume

A small goof on a resume can cause your resume to end up in a big trash bin. Make these simple changes and increase your chances of being seriously considered:

- 1. **Spell-check and friend-check.** Your PC's spell-check program is a great help but don't rely on it exclusively. Have a friend review your resume word for word and look for grammar and spelling errors.
- 2. Be truthful. Don't exaggerate your experience, job

titles, responsibilities or anything else for that matter. The truth will certainly be uncovered, especially through the increasingly more common practice of background checks.

- 3. **Keep your resume to one page.** For most people this is sufficient. Use your cover letter to expand on your accomplishments and capabilities.
- Make it professional. No smudges or accidental pen marks. Plain white or cream paper is best. Don't use fancy stationery or bright paper colors. This distracts recruiters from reviewing your skills.
- Maintain a logical, consistent format. Whether you use a skill-based or chronological format, maintain consistency. If you list "achievements" in one job, list "achievements"
 - for all jobs. Organize the information from most recent to earliest experience and education.
- Mention references or portfolio. If you have references or a portfolio, mention that these are available "upon request".
